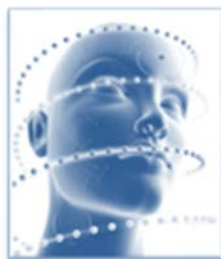


Ready to use Lessons

WHO: High school & middle school teachers who integrate science, mathematics, engineering, and technology (STEM) subject areas into their curriculum.

WHAT: A three-day summer workshop that integrates Nebraska businesses with secondary technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) educators. Teachers will participate in industry tours, review and incorporate The Best of Project SHINE lessons into their classrooms and participate in fun hands-on lab activities.

WHEN: The workshop is offered from Monday through Wednesday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with an **optional** Industry tour on Thursday, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and includes a **\$100 daily** stipend. Sessions are: **Session 1: June 3rd-6th, 2013 and Session 2: June 10th-13th, 2013**
